Homework and how long?

Every student is different, but below is a rough guide to how many hours you should spend every day on homework and study combined. Remember, it takes experimentation to find out what suits you. Your study times should most of all suit your academic needs and goals:

First year -1.5 hours per day

Second year – 2 hrs per day Third year – 2.5/3 hrs per day Fifth year – 3-4 hrs per day Sixth year – 3.5hrs-5 hrs per day

It obviously depends on the student. More time might be needed for upcoming tests or CBA's.

If you feel homework is excessive, let the subject teacher know.
